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


Howard Gardner introduced the idea of multiple intelligences as a way of understanding the individual strengths of different learners and the varied ways in which they excel.

His eight different intelligences consist of linguistic, logical/mathematical, spatial, bodily-kinesthetic, musical, interpersonal, intrapersonal and naturalist. In response, we are increasingly defining spaces relative to activity and interaction rather than rigid programs.

The color wheel (at right) suggests a **spectrum of action verbs** reflecting the interrelationship of learning intelligences and spaces to accommodate them. As we create spaces for students of all ages, we aspire to apply the nimble, light brushstroke of a watercolorist.

Providing photo voltaic panels for solar energy in conjunction with providing electric bus charging stations and infrastructure help improve children's health by reducing exposure to air pollution.

A spacious courtyard with lots of places to hang out and gather is an important outdoor room and the heart of the campus.



We know that each learner possesses a unique combination of intelligences that defines their unique abilities and ways of navigating the world.


In response, we create a variety of settings for learning – both interior and exterior – that accommodate the individual, or a small group outside the typical classroom.


